

### “Club 52” Growing!



If you have entered the Club lately, you may have noticed the “52 Club” pictures on the wall behind the reception desk. Those boys and girls as the number indicates have attended the Club at least 52 times since September. Everyday someone is added to the list. Why 52 days?

#### An Independent Study

In 2009 Public/Private Ventures an independent research group at the request of BGCA published the results of a five year a study to test the

degree to which teens’ overall experiences at a Club might prove to be more than the sum of Clubs’ programs. Other research projects had focused on studying the targeted outcomes of individual Club programs, and it seemed possible that they had missed the bigger picture. Could it be that those combined experiences that the Clubs offer their members had the potential for influencing a larger and broader array of outcomes than had previously been considered.

#### The Findings

The findings suggested that setting a target of 122 to 244 days of attendance over a 30-month period fosters a level of engagement that may be most likely to promote positive outcomes, particularly in the healthy lifestyles area. These rates over 30



months translate roughly to a participation level of 52 to 104 days per year. Simply speaking, attending the Club without measuring any specific program participation by a boy or girl changes their lives.

#### Enter—“52 Club”

With those results in mind the leadership team of the Club created a formal program to recognize those boys and girls who attend the Club 52 times or more this year. Using the attendance program, *Continued on page 3 inside*

## Lebron James Foundation Grant Batting Cage

Baseball and golf have taken a prominent place at the Club with the addition of a batting cage/golf practice installation. Computers to follow!

Thanks to a grant from the Lebron James Foundation the Club has a new baseball/softball cage and pitching machine. The foundation is also giving the Club fifteen new desk top computers, a laptop computer, a \$2000 Technology award and a \$7,500 award for supplies from Nike.

## New Snack Bar Director... New Directions

David Salafia has stepped in as the new Director of The Dunkin Donuts Junior Staff Program and changes are already producing results for the staff and Club.

One of the “Flagship” programs at the Club for teens is the Dunkin Donuts Junior Staff Program. Funded by a grant from the Battista Family, owners of several DD stores including those in Meriden, the program is teaching work skills and responsibility while it generates some income for the Club.

As a restaurant owner, David taught successful 4 week cooking classes at his restaurant for Club members. "I always liked working with 'at-risk' kids in the community and see this as a natural transition for me," said Salafia. "Young people today have fewer opportunities such as factory work that they can transition into and I saw food services as a way to create a rewarding career. The Club asked me to consider taking the position and I see it as a way to use my background to help Club members"

Goals for the Year

When asked about the goals he has for the year, David replied: "I want to change the look of the Snack bar to make it more attractive and efficient for the staff members to do a good job when it comes to customer service. We talk about the importance of good customer service, greeting them with a smile, suggesting items they may be unaware of, and insuring quality throughout the process."

"I also want to be a mentor for

our staff members to help them get into the work force. We stress this program is a privilege for them to be a part of because of the support Dunkin Donuts gives the program financially but also training and job opportunity wise. They have been supportive of the members and want our program to succeed," he added.

"Adding the "vendor" concept to the program enables the staffers to bring the Snack Bar to the people in the stands. Staffers develop a marketing concept that is not present standing behind the counter. It forces them to be more outgoing and realize they are "sellers" too.

Bottom Line Improvement

All the new additions and structure has made a difference in the revenue generated in the Snack Bar. David makes sure staffers see the results and that they realize that if they do their job well, results will follow... they already have!

from the ceiling, the grant enabled the purchase of a baseball/softball pitching, pitching mounds, baseballs and softballs, "L" screen for protection and mats for golf swing practice.

Ease of Storage & Use

The cage structure stores in the ceiling and is raised and lowered by an electric winch. The strut on one basket had to be reversed to accommodate the ceiling storage. Once it is at ground level the netting provides a safety barrier to prevent batted or thrown balls from escaping into the gymnasium.

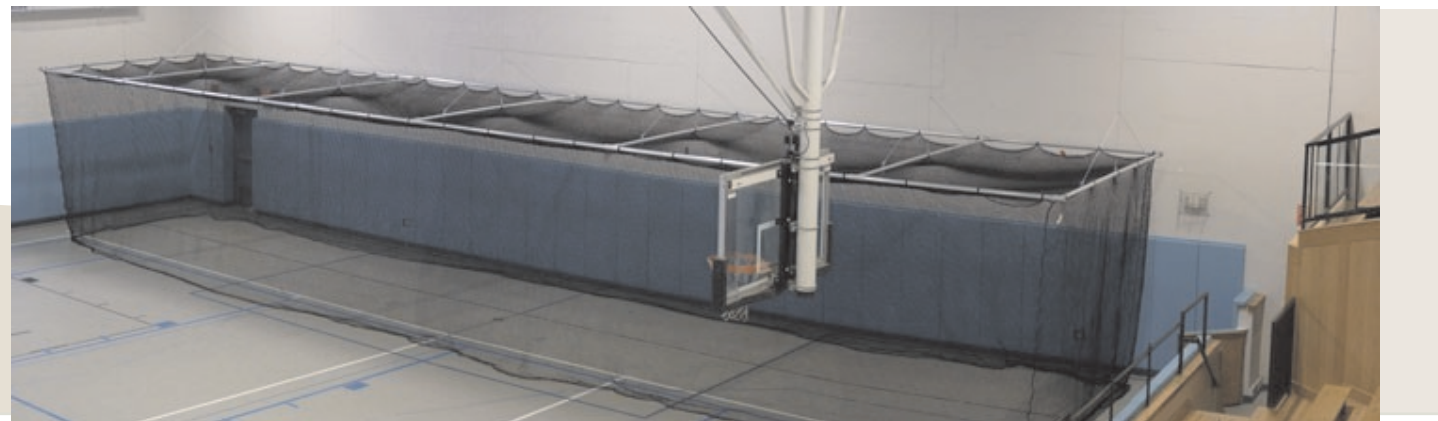
Pitching mounds provide a realistic pitching ex-

perience for members and can be used inside or outside the netting.

There are 5 mats that when set up inside the netting allow supervised members to receive golf swing instruction or to schedule group practice sessions. Once again the netting absorbs the force from the golf balls and keeps them inside the structure.

Rentals Available

Several requests have already made by local area baseball teams of all levels to rent the facility. The advantage of renting the cage in the off-Club hours is that the gymnasium can be included to provide more indoor practice

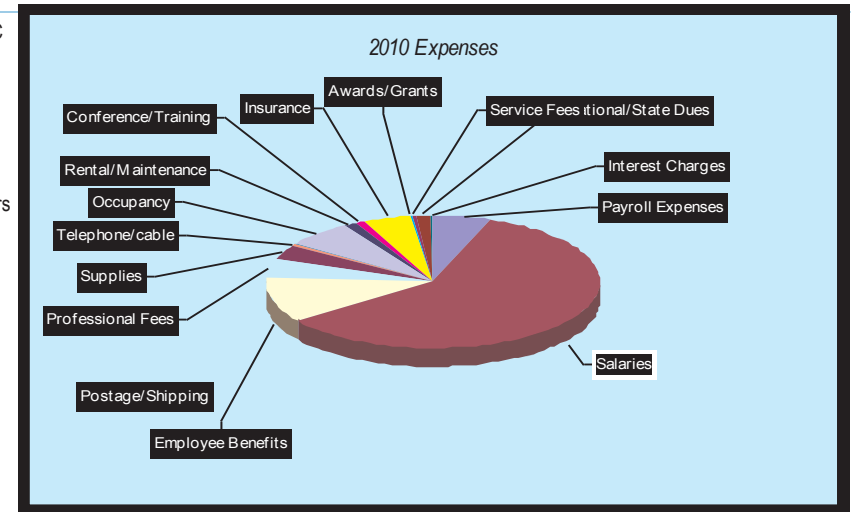

**Archery News**



Over the last few years the Club's archery program, under the direction of Sr. Program Director Dominic Pereyo has grown in to one of the Club's most unique programs. So unique in fact that finding other organizations to shoot against has been one of the bigger challenges. "As far as I know we are one of the only Clubs in the nation that has a rifle range and a full slate of shooting programs" said Dominic. The Club offers air rifle (BB and pellet guns), rifle (.22 caliber) programs as well as archery. Many Boys & Girls Clubs offer archery as part of their summer camp programs but few have taken it beyond that.

**Archery Team Formed**

While the air rifle and rifle programs have remained steady over the last few years the archery program has blossomed. The Club's intramural league has 45 youth on 5 teams. 14 of the more advanced members of the league have competed against a small, but growing number of area clubs and schools including the Cheshire Archery Club and Choate Rosemary Hall.

**Ready, Aim, Fire**

Always looking for ways to expand the shooting programs Dominic is trying a new program for Week 9 at CUNO Camp this year called Ready, Aim, FIRE! "After watching Top Shot on the History Channel, I was thinking this might be fun to adapt for the kids" he said. Youth in the program will get to shoot archery, air rifle and even rifle at various fun, reactive and challenging targets while learning about safety and a little about the history of the bow and the gun.

**First Perfect Scores in 2011**

Ben Romine and Dominik Angerosa became the first Club archers to

shoot a perfect scores of 50 for 2011. Ben has been shooting at the Club for just under a year and currently holds a silver rank with a score of 283 out of a possible 300.

Dominick became the second archer to achieve a perfect score in 2011. Dominick has been shooting in the Club for 2 years and currently holds a Silver rank (270-279 pts. out of a possible 300) in the Club's 13 level ranking system. The number one archer in the Little John Division of the Club's Archery League, Dominick has also been an important part of the Club's travel archery team.

**Archer Reaches Gold Rank**

Jacob Wronski became the third Club archer to achieve the rank of gold (290 or higher out of 300) in the Boys & Girls Club of Meriden's Archery Program. He is also the current high score holder with a score of 294 out of a possible 300 at a distance of 10 yds. Jacob has been shooting in the Club's program for four years now.

records are regularly reviewed to add names of those reaching the qualifying number.

**The Areas of Improvement**

In particular, the findings were that Club participation is related to youth's positive and healthy development in the three outcome areas Boys & Girls Clubs of America has established as core to meeting its mission: good character and citizenship, academic success and healthy lifestyles.

**Academic, Healthy Life Styles and Citizenship Positive Outcomes**

The study focused on numerous outcomes but those that showed definite growth in 52-122 days are:

1. Academic Success Outcomes such as decreased number of times skipping school, increased academic confidence, and increased school effort.
2. Healthy Lifestyles Outcomes such as lower likelihood of starting to carry a weapon, smoke cigarettes, drink alcohol, smoke marijuana and have sexual intercourse.
3. Character/Citizenship Outcomes such as higher levels of community service involvement, and increased levels of knowing right from wrong.

The goal is to fill the wall with pictures of those who are growing by walking through the door.



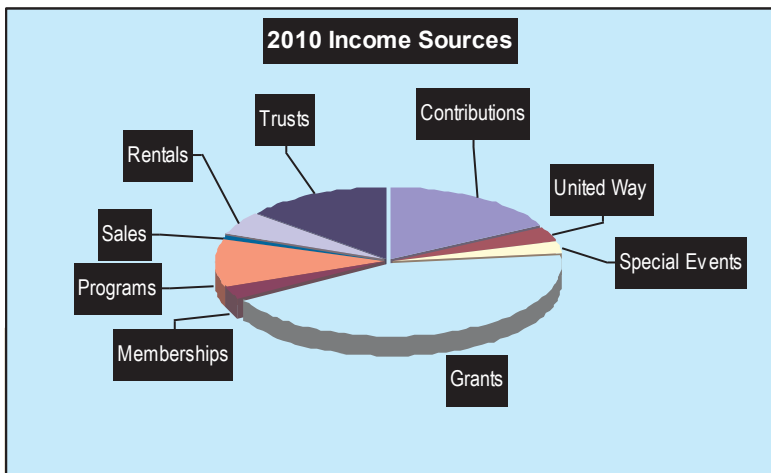
